"No matter what gets done... and how much is left undone... I am enough."

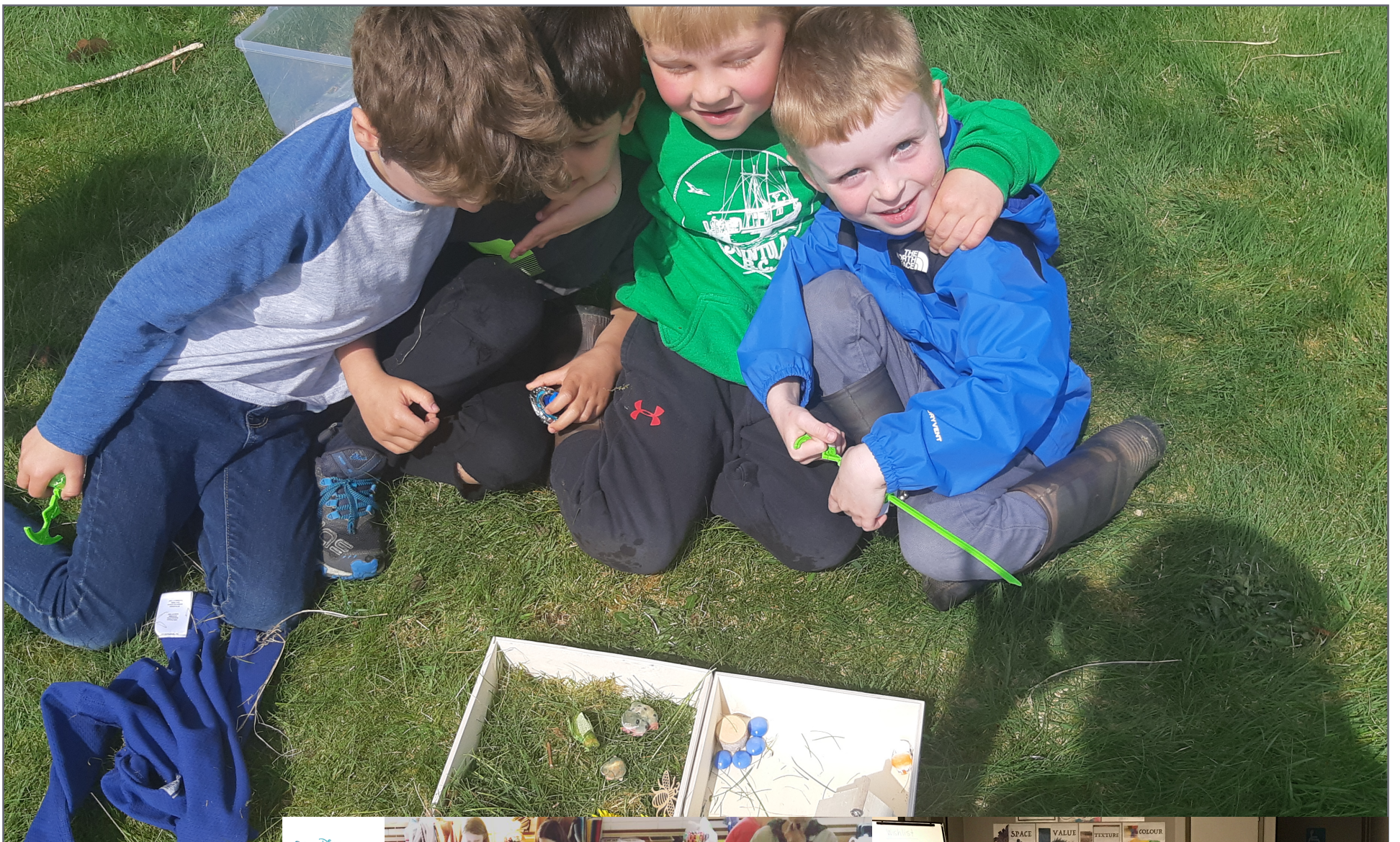

Bus & Playground Expectations

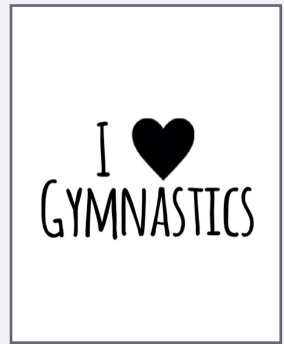

Cell Phones

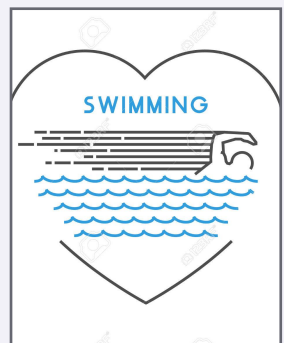
